The GDCO Executive Committee is very pleased to report on the status of the 2010-2011 GDCO Scholarship Program and the achievements/accomplishments of its beneficiaries. In last year's report, we indicated that there were 300 students, 144 girls (48 percent) and 156 boys (52 percent) recruited from 26 preparatory high schools that benefited from the GDCO Scholarship. Out of the 144 female students, all girls who were in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade have been promoted to the 12<sup>th</sup> grade, and those that were in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade have joined the various national universities in the country.

In the current academic year, which ended at the end of June 2011, another 300 students in 30 preparatory high schools have benefited from the scholarship program. We are glad to report that, in contrast to last academic year, the number of female students benefiting from the GDCO Scholarship has increased this year – there were 150 female students and 150 male students. The table below gives a breakdown of the students by school and gender.

All scholarship recipients who were in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade have been promoted to the 12<sup>th</sup> grade, and those that were in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade have taken the national university entrance examination. The results of the university entrance examination will be announced in September 2011. Given past records, we are confident that all those that have taken the university entrance exam will achieve the required score and will enter the various universities in the county.

In the coming academic year, 2011-2012 we plan to continue the program by awarding scholarship to another cohort of 300 students (50% females and 50% males) in 30 preparatory high schools.

#### Funding

With regard to funding, last year we received a total of \$42,000.00 from foundations and individuals. A total of \$27,500.00 has been transferred through the bank to cover the Scholarship payment to students. Only 10% has been retained to cover administrative costs. The balance is maintained in our account.

Students were paid a monthly stipend of \$9.00 for 10 months. The total direct scholarship payment for the 2010-2011 academic years was \$27,000.00 [\$9 X 300 X 10]. Another \$500.00 (1.8%) was used for administrative cost. Thus, the total budget for the academic year 2010-2011 was \$27,500.00.

#### GDCO's contribution included:

In kind service (volunteers)

- Professional service in research, planning and reporting; directing and monitoring the execution of the program and evaluation.
- Administrative and Secretarial services.

#### **Financial Contribution:**

GDCO members and supporters contribution varies from \$12,000.00 to \$14,000.00 every year. The contribution for this year, including pledges, was \$11,850.00 from individuals and \$30,000.00 from organizations. The attached list of contributors indicates the collected amount.

#### **Budget for Next Year**

Because of the significant decline in the purchasing power of the <u>birr</u> due to the devaluation made by the government, we plan to raise the monthly stipend of each student for 2011-2012 from \$9.00 to \$10.00. The budget that will be needed to cover this stipend would be \$30,000.00 [\$10 X 300 X 10]. Another 10% (\$3,000.00) will be needed to cover overhead. Hence, our expected budget for 2011-2012 will be \$33,000.00.

The organizations that have helped us in the last two years, have already informed us that we shouldn't depend of them for future funding. At best, they can match the fund we have raised from our members; at worst, they may not be able to help since they have other demands. This warning is a very important point that our members should keep in mind. Unless more members/partners are willing to extend their hand and contribute to the scholarship fund, we have a serious concern that the scholarship program will be in jeopardy. Remember, if you contribute just \$100.00, you can pretty much cover the fund for one student.

Among the highlights on the activities of our organization include the visit by the Chair of the Scholarship Committee and the former Director of the Executive Committee. Dr. Genet Desta, Chair of the Scholarship Committee and Mr. Wondayehu Kassa, former Executive Director of GDCO visited several schools in Gondar and surrounding areas and met with our scholarship recipients and partners. They were very impressed with the level of enthusiasm shown by the students and the appreciation expressed both by the students and government education officials. (See pictures)
